

PLAYFAIR Activities for Elementary Students

Unlike secondary school students who can take more responsibility in developing and organizing events, elementary students will require a little more direction. Try to ensure that the students aren't just performing but are expressing their own ideas and issues.

CLASS PRESENTATIONS

Whether it's a skit or an information presentation, take your team class-to-class to make presentations. Your team can help create classroom activities, games or art projects that they could have classroom students participate in.

ART EXHIBIT

Create an exhibit depicting artwork that expresses issues of Disability, Social Justice and Inclusion. Invite other students not involved with Playfair to submit artwork.

POSTER CAMPAIGN

Design and create a poster campaign and blanket your school with posters for a designated period. Support this campaign with school announcements.

WRITE, CREATE & PRESENT SKITS OR PLAYS

Focusing on Disability, Social Justice and Inclusion, develop skits or plays that will challenge your audience and increase their awareness of the issues.

COLOURING OR STORY CONTEST

Have your team create a colouring book and then promote a colouring contest throughout the school. Just make sure the pictures address issues of Disability, Social Justice and Inclusion. For a variation, you could also run a story writing contest dealing with the issues.
