HOW WE ARE ORGANIZED:

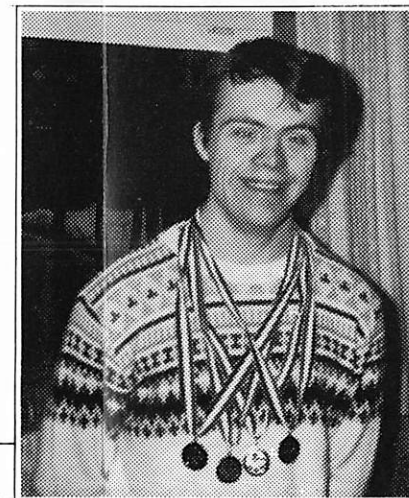
- Our Board of Directors provides leadership for the association and for the committees responsible for achieving our goals.

GOALS OF DSAMT:

- To pursue civil and human rights and equality of opportunity for persons with Down Syndrome.
- To promote a positive and accurate image of persons with Down Syndrome in the community.
- To pursue the full integration of persons with Down Syndrome into all aspects of Canadian society - education, employment, recreation, etc.
- To work towards the establishment of a medical intervention clinic for persons with Down Syndrome.
- To ensure the availability of appropriate quality services for all persons with Down Syndrome.
- To provide a forum for the sharing of information for members of DSAMT.

DSAMT STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES:

- All persons with Down Syndrome have the right to be raised at home with a family.
- All persons with Down Syndrome have the same human and legal rights as other Canadian citizens.
- All persons with Down Syndrome have the right to supports and services as needed, with out prejudice; including newborns.
- All persons with Down Syndrome are entitled to quality medial care, without prejudice.
- All persons with Down Syndrome are raised at home or whose guardianship is held by the Province are entitled to quality services and equal opportunities to develop to their full potential.
